



## GIFT QUIZ

YOU MAY HAVE HEARD OF SENSORY DEPRIVATION chambers, otherwise known as isolation tanks, dark and soundproof containers filled with a foot of salt water where you can submerge into complete nothingness. The first one was designed in 1954 by John C. Lilly, an American physician and neuroscientist. He designed the quiet float tank to study the origins of consciousness by cutting off all external stimuli. It is best to think of this kind of tank, this method of experience, this return to the womb, when you consider this Gift Quiz.

Most of us think of tests as intellectual exercises, places where we are challenged to get something right or wrong...or to be seen in a good light or a bad light. The matter of a Gift Quiz must avoid all of these distortions to execute properly. You'll only be cheating yourself if you don't submerge away from them.

It is not easy to begin to try and tune in, completely and utterly, to one's spirit, to one's emotions. Especially men. I know as I am one of them. There are no right or wrong answers here, only chances to tune into the radio signal of your Gift, perhaps for the first time, and to respond in accordance with your true inner motivations and feelings. Notice that there are only "yes" answers involved. If you feel any hesitation, or you feel like you do something sometimes or once in a while, do not mark that statement.

As a guidepost, if you end up with only 10 or 12 "yes" answers (out of the 70 questions), you are more likely to locate your Gift. You're trying

to feel here what really jumps out at you on a purely emotional or spiritual level, to identify when forms of sparks and electricity show up.

So try to climb into the deprivation tank, if you can, when you take this Gift Quiz. Try to block out everything else and just float, float in the tank, float in your feelings, float in your spirit. Uncovered honesty. Try and let yourself tune into your natural given emotional, spiritual, and Gift reflexes.

Take the Gift Quiz all at once, straight through, with a concerted effort to focus on internal transparency. Don't look at how to score the results until after you have finished. Have fun with this. After all is done and scored, try to isolate questions you might identify with others.

- You find it almost impossible to say no when someone asks you for help. (16)


- You can't wait to authenticate new insights and information by checking with your resources, commentaries, and other such authorities. (17)


